In Italy the Accordion, which Italians call fisarmonica, shows up in many Italian traditional and popular orchestras and dances. There are two cities in Italy where the manufacturing of accordions is well established. The most famous is Castelfidardo.

Did you know: Eugenia Marini is one of the most esteemed classical accordion performers on the international scene, having also a degree in violoncello. After a remarkable artistic experience as a violoncellist with the Chamber Orchestra "Angelicum of Milan", she has dedicated herself to the development and enhancement of the **classic accordion**, the instrument with which she began her musical studies. She was a student of M° Vittorio Melocchi of Milan and under his guidance she achieved many prestigious awards at international competitons. As a concert soloist she has performed mainly music from the baroque period to the 19th century, always obtaining a positiv consensus from both critics and public. She has played as the soloist with many prestigious chamber and italian sinfonic orchestras as well as recording several CD's for important labels such as EMI CLASSICS

Michele Bianco ~ Michele Bianco graduated in accordion at the top of his class, with a score of 110/110 with honors and special mention, at the Music Conservatory "T. Schipa "of Lecce, in the class of Maestro Germano Scurti.accordion Michele Bianco has secured multiple first prizes and podium placements in esteemed national and international music competitions. Among these achievements are the First Prize at the "Accordion Star International Competition" in 2021

Carnival of Venice ~ Pietro Frosini's most famous work as he would have liked us to play it. I know I'll never be able to play it this good...especially the staccato bellows shake at the end. **This piece of "accordion history"** is from an album labeled "Pietro Frosini Original Recordings' which were recorded between 1920-1935 This historic recording vividly shows his amazing virtuosity & playful style. Pietro Frosini was born in Catania, Sicily where he began the study of chromatic accordion at age six. However, since the accordion was at that time not accepted as a major instrument, he undertook the study of piano, cornet, & other band instruments. At age 14, his remarkable talent on the cornet was recognized, & he was accepted as first chair cornetist in the British Naval Band at Malta. But his first love always remained the accordion.

Day 3 - Thursday, October 24

Venice

Overnight: <u>Hotel Tintoretto</u> or similar

After breakfast you will meet your guide for a half day Venice walking visit including Doge Palace. The rest of the day is to enjoy Venice, or maybe take a water taxi to the Island of Burano.

Accordion Connections: The patent for the accordion was filed in Vienna in 1829 by Cyrill Demian, but it was fundamentally **redesigned in Italy** in the second half of the nineteenth century.

Castelfidardo was the scene of a crucial moment in the unification of Italy, when the papal army was defeated by the Piedmontese troops, with the subsequent annexation of the territories of Marche and Umbria to the Kingdom of Italy. This area was the cradle in which the first "organetti" or "fisarmoniche" were developed.

Day 4 - Friday, October 25

Overnight: <u>Hotel Mare Home</u> or similar

After breakfast transfer by private motor launch to Venice bus terminal. Continue by coach, to *Ravenna* for a half day guided tour of the enchanting Byzantine monuments and mosaics, including the Tomb of the Great Dante poet, best known for The Divine Comedy.

Ravenna ~ With its UNESCO World Heritage Sites, annual music festival, and delicious local cuisine, Ravenna offers a delightful blend of ancient charm and modern vibrancy, making it a captivating and unforgettable destination for travelers of all ages. End this day in Cesenatico at Hotel Mare Home, your seaside hotel.

- 12. Tuning small instruments

Did you know...

Victoria was founded in 1919 by Dario Dari and Adriano Picchietti.

The factory later changed its name to Victoria. The production concentrated from the beginning on high quality accordions. Victoria was one of the first factories that started to produce converted accordions hence the name "Victoria converter"

Day 5 - Saturday, October 26

Cesenatico Meals Included: BD

Overnight: <u>Hotel Mare Home</u> or similar

This morning on your way to Cesenatico, you will stop for a visit at le Salina. The Cervia Salt Pan is the smallest in Italy covering 827 hectares in a natural park, and now a natural breeding and nesting reserve for many animal and plant species, including the pink flamingos. Here you can enjoy a historical walking tour dedicated to the history of the Salina di Cervia ~ of the ancient "Camillone" artisan-run salt works, instruments and ancient methods of salt collection. After lunch, return to the hotel for your Piadina Experience - where you will learn the art of preparing the signature dish of Romagna, *LA PIADINA!* To top off this day, you will be entertained by local accordionists to cheer the evening on.

Did you know... Cesenatico is the headquarters of the famous (in Italy)Orchestra family ~ Raoul Casadei https://www.casadei.it/area-musicisti- casadei/?swoof=1&pa_strumento=fisarmonica

One of the most important parts of the orchestra is the accordion \sim especially in this region.

At the moment there are no scheduled concerts - but the schedule is always being updated.

Day 6 - Sunday, October 27

Overnight: Castelfidardo or area - TBA

After breakfast, continue to Castelfidardo, with a stop along the way in San Marino on the way, a mountainous microstate of the Medieval age, a small gem within the territory of Italy. After lunch continue to Castelfidardo for your guided tour of the Museum della Fisarmonica. End our day in Castelfidardo

Accordion Connections:

Castelfidardo is the international capital of accordion builders. A variety of other musical instruments besides the accordion have been produced in the town since the 19th century, such as the armonica.

The Accordions of Castelfidardo - "Globally, Castelfidardo represents the pinnacle of the instrument's development, allowing top musicians to embrace well crafted and reliable accordions.

International Accordion Museum: On 9 May 1981 the city of Castelfidardo inaugurated the International Accordion **Museum**. Castelfidardo is known throughout the world for the production of this instrument, thanks to the ingenuity of Paolo Soprani who created the first Italian accordion industry in 1863.

Day 7 - Monday, October 28

Overnight: Castelfidardo or area - TBA

This morning's experience will take place in both the Beltuna and Victoria accordion factories.

~ Beltuna ~ Your guided tour will illustrate all the various stages of accordion making, then to their showroom where an artist's concert will be given by one of their accordionists.

 \sim Victoria Accordionist: On this visit you will have the opportunity to admire the many wonderful hand-built instruments. See how the reeds and bellows are made, with a brief informational time on how to make small repairs. In the factory showrooms, you will attend musical demonstrations, with the opportunity to play a few of their high-quality accordions. The rest of the day is yours to explore Castelfidardo, searching through accordion shops.

Frosinone - Home of the Licinio Refice Conservatory of Music

The Licinio Refice Conservatory of Music, founded in 1972, is one of the main Italian conservatories with its 130 teachers and 1200 students.

It offers courses relating to all orchestral instruments, organ, piano, harpsichord, accordion, singing, composition, conducting, band instrumentation, as well as music teaching, jazz music and electronic music. It is also possible to choose training courses ranging from "Ancient Music" to "Modern Music and for Entertainment", to Music in relation to New Technologies. Among the teachers are prestigious personalities in the field of performance and research, with experience from classical to

jazz and everyday music.

The production activities have made the Frosinone Conservatory one of the main cultural centers in the area; carries out an intense artistic and cultural activity not only aimed at improving the educational offer for its students but also open to the outside to qualify the cultural offer of the entire territory. It is divided into concert seasons, concert lessons, conferences with the participation of teachers and students, but also former students and established musicians.

The Conservatory has its own Symphony Orchestra and Jazz Orchestra. The recording studio was inaugurated in 2009. Intermediate projects have also recently seen the light of day, with the fusion of music, poetry and visual arts and with the use of new technologies.
